Dear Parents / Carers,

We enjoyed a stunning day at The Big Coronation Picnic last Sunday. It was a real community celebration and it was fantastic to see so many of you there, enjoying the sunshine and each other's company. As ever, we appreciate your support in communicating your expectations – which I would hope are very close to our own – to your children.
