### <u>Lunchtime Football – Mr Yeomans</u>

As of Monday 8th of October, Over & In will be providing specific lunchtime football supervision on a trial basis. Boys and girls of all primary schools love football at lunch times, for some (including me when I was a young lad) it is the highlight of their day. However, we all know that with this passion comes disagreement and argument. In a lot of schools, football is banned purely for this reason.

We offer a service in the local area where a coach comes in to school at lunch times and specifically focuses on refereeing and educating the players on how to enjoy playing football fairly and competitively without this resulting in argument and unhappiness. The results of this work in a number of different ways...

The players of lunch time football begin to learn how to deal with disagreements with the supervision of an adult who knows the rules and can explain things thoroughly. The end goal for us is that we get to a situation where the children learn this concept so well that we then stand back and supervise and let them figure out their issues alone. Therefore teaching the children to be responsible with how to deal with problems, is something they can hold onto in later life.

The midday supervisors don't have to worry about what goes on, on the football pitch (which notoriously amounts to a large proportion of playtime upset) and can focus their time on the remainder of the children enjoying their lunch time.

The children will enter the school after their lunch time in a much more reasonable and level-headed manor after not having their disgruntlement unfairly dealt with, or having their beloved football taken away.

I'm confident that this will have a positive effect on the lunch time hour and on the children and staff within the school.
