Key Vocabulary

Africa – the second largest continent

Continents - a continent is one of several very large landmasses.

Countries – a country is defined as a nation. Lots of countries make up a continent

Oceans – a large body of salt water that covers most of the Earth's surface

Physical features – The features that are man-made or naturally-created are known as geographical features.

Human features - things that have been made by human for example: bridges, towers, buildings, town, cities, houses and farm.
