Your main focus should be making sure your children are as happy as they can be and give them time to talk if they are worried or want to ask questions. In order to keep them safe we have taken away everything they deem normal. Contact with other children, wider family members and learning in a classroom with other learners to bounce ideas around with. Whilst in this situation we are also asking them to do work. We will know ourselves that it is extremely hard to produce high quality work when we are stressed so it must be very hard for our children. Be kind to yourselves and your families. We will pick educating your children up when they come back to school. For now, do a little bit each day – if Google Classroom helps you to structure your day then great. If sometimes you just need to take a step back and watch a film as a family or just the children so that you can focus on your own jobs, then that is fine. We are all in this together, we are all struggling with the new normal. Do what you feel is right for your family and we will support you where we can.

Reopening Plans

There has been much speculation in the media this week about reopening schools and what that will look like, which is very unhelpful. The truth is that, until Boris speaks on Sunday we do not know what the plans are. The Local Authority are working very hard to produce guidance for us and for you as parents as to what school will look like when we reopen.
