Message from the Head...

Dear Parents / Carers,

In the afternoon our Key Stage 2 children were equally engaged, and it was a pleasure to welcome so many of you to the community event after school. We have adjusted our lunchtime arrangements for children in Key Stage 2 this week. The changes are to ensure we are able to effectively supervise children in all the spaces that are used, including playgrounds, field, cloakrooms, lunch hall and corridors. The children have responded positively overall and we have been impressed with the way they have moved safely through the building and around this site. With the support, again, of our fabulous PTA team, we have invested this week in new goalposts for Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 football pitches, along with new basketball hoops with backboards, and new basketballs. Our expectation is that children will engage pro-socially with each other and our spaces. We want to make sure the facilities for them to access are supportive and engaging.

I have heard some very positive feedback about the children's respectful listening and confident public speaking. With online safety a regular topic in national news and education safeguarding, I would like to encourage you to 'check-in' with your child's online activities and communications. We have been made aware of concern about group chats in Snapchat and WhatsApp, in which children are being unkind to others. I would urge you to reflect on the age guidance for these apps: Snapchat - 16+; WhatsApp - 13+. Our children are unlikely to be mature enough, socially and emotionally, to consistently handle these types of communication effectively. Please support your child to interact safely and sensibly.
