Emotional Wellbeing and Mental Health

The mental health of children is a subject that has had a lot of media coverage recently. From 2020 each primary school is required to have a 'Mental Health lead', this would be a teacher who would oversee the provision that we as a school provide. This is not a new issue but children of today face the pressure of an 'Everything, right now' society where Social Media is prevalent and can be an anxiety inducing tool. We are fortunate that some of our Teaching Assistants have recently received excellent training on how to run groups for children that help them talk about and deal with feelings that can often become overwhelming. Every child in school will have some form of provision, as this important area is also covered in the PSHE curriculum. We also now have access to a trained counsellor who works with us on a Thursday and a Play Therapist. If you would like to know more about this then please do speak to me.

Values Day

Mrs Turner is organising a school 'Values Day' on the last day of this half term — Friday 5th April. The day will encourage each class to come off the curriculum and focus on a project involving one of our values. This may be through the media of art, technology, music or another subject.
